Called to be Champions

Have you ever been on the losing end of a lopsided basketball game? The other team is winning 75-20 or some ridiculous score like that. All you want to do is get the game over with and it's only the first half of the game. What does a coach say to a team that is so far behind that it seems crazy to continue playing? I've played in games like that and I've watched games like that. I've also seen and played in games where we came from a long way back to finally win.

I don't know how far you are behind in your bills. It might be so far that it seems no longer worth it to even keep trying to pay them.

Some of us are far behind in relationships. There are so many deficits that the possibility of restoration with some friends or family members is nowhere in sight.

The last medical report may show that after all that has been done, things have only gotten worse.

Others may have deficits in your emotions or in your spirit. You expected to be in a certain place in your life by now and the years have gone by and the deficit between how long it takes to accomplish some things and how much time you feel you have left is staggering. Someone told you that if you don't get your big break in life by the time you're 21 or 30 years old, then it's too late.

We know how you feel. Just read some of my blogs and you'll know we know how you're feeling. More importantly though, the Lord knows how you feel.

Right now, it does not matter how far you are behind in this game. Your coach, the Holy Spirit, has called a team meeting and He has something to tell you before sending you back out in what seems to be a pointless exercise in futility.

God says in His word:

In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes,

though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:5-7)

Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:36-39)

My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing. If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. (James 1:2-5)

And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown. Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air. But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified. (1 Corinthians 9:25-27)

Though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, (2 Corinthians 10:3-5)

You therefore must **endure hardship as a good soldier of Jesus Christ**. No one engaged in warfare entangles himself with the affairs of this life, that he may please him who enlisted him as a soldier. And also if anyone competes in athletics, he is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules.

(2 Timothy 2:3-5)

Come on Family, we can get through this. There's been a strong wave of discouragement and doubt that has come against us. However, we are called to be champions!

God has given us the strategy for breakthrough. He told us to fast and pray. I just completed my first weekend of fasting and prayer and I kept hearing the question, "How bad do you want it?" to which I kept answering, "Lord I want it more than food!"

How bad do you want to see God's promises explode over your life? Stop seeking the promises and start chasing after God himself.

I encourage you to join with us in daily food denials. Whether it is breakfast, lunch, or dinner, take one mealtime and decide to get in the presence of the Lord. Read your word, put on your headphones and listen to some worship music and really go for it and lose yourself in the presence of God. When you do that, you'll find it easier to begin to lose yourself in the will of God.

I encourage you to join with Carol and me in our home on Sunday mornings for prayer. Don't let your schedule, your *to do* list, and even the *must do* list, take the top priority in your life. We're not meeting to talk about prayer and we're not just teaching it - we're doing it!

God is changing us already. As your pastor, I've already been deeply impacted by the presence of God. My attitude has changed. From this point on, we are not coming out weak. Just say that to yourself right now, "There's no defeat in me!"

The enemy has a big lead after the first half of this game, but we're in the locker room right now and it is halftime. Coach is talking to us and He's strengthening us. This is more than a pep talk. This is a life impartation. We're receiving the life, energy, and power of God.

This is your word for this midweek connection. We look to see you again this Sunday and we're coming with new expectation. Let's step up our confession from, "God *can* do anything" to "God *will* do anything!" God will do it for us. Come on family! Believe God! Believe God!

Just because the enemy has a big lead on us doesn't mean he's won. I made all kinds of blunders and mistakes when we moved here. The game started and we got whipped from the opening tip-off. We fumbled the ball, we committed fouls, we missed shots, we missed passes, and we tripped and fell. Have you ever seen a basketball team looking really bad? We dribbled the ball off our feet. We called timeout only to come back out and keep messing up over and over again. And all the while, the enemy has been scoring and running up the points against us. By the time we started getting ourselves together and scoring a few points, we were way behind on the scoreboard.

For three years, we've been playing from behind and falling further into a deficit. But, I found out something in my first weekend in the Lord's presence. God just wants the victory to be that much more spectacular.

Nothing is sweeter in athletics than the come-from-behind victory. And we're not going to win by one point on the last second of the game either. God's going to cause the comeback to blow the enemy away. It'll be so big that you will call the fruit of your victories Manasseh and Ephraim. Manasseh means "For God has made me forget all my toil." Ephraim means "For God has caused me to be fruitful in the land of my affliction."

If you find yourself saying, "I'm tired. It won't make any difference. Things will never change," then please allow us to speak this over your life:

Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy. (1Peter 4:12-13)

For You, O God, have tested us; You have refined us as silver is refined. You brought us into the net; You laid affliction on our backs. You have caused men to ride over our heads; We went through fire and through water; **But You brought us out to rich fulfillment**. I will go into Your house with burnt offerings; I will pay You my vows. (Psalm 66:10-13)

The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:7-9)

We can't force you and we'll never try to manipulate you, but we strongly encourage you to shake off the heaviness right now, in the name of Jesus Christ. You will win! We will win! We've already won!

After we spend this time in the locker room, we're going back out there and we're going to score. Our defense will be devastating to the enemy. He's doesn't know it, but he's scored all he's going to score. He doesn't know it, but he hasn't seen us execute God's game plan yet. He won't be able to concentrate on one player because God's going to use everybody. From slam dunks to a downpour of three's we're bringing the rain and the rim shakers. (*That's sports talk for the uninitiated*).

Now, instead of dreading going back out there, we can't wait to get back out there. Now we have to pace ourselves and stay before the Lord to get His will. We have to receive His strength. We must remain humble and not get lifted up in our abilities. We've been pretty weak and this has gone on for a long time, but that's all over now.

And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. (2 Corinthians 12:9)

For those who get this email outside of the church family, I urge you to gather with your church family and pray. Let the Spirit of God revive that sense of intimacy and openness to the Lord. When was the last time you cried, just because you love Him? Spit that

complaint out of your mouth. Reject focusing on yourself. Refuse to give in to fear.

Come on family, let's do this!

Today we have another praise report for you. It looks like God is making us examples to the flock just like Peter admonished the leaders of the early church. We're Building People

Our overnight time of fasting and prayer together was really wonderful! God is bonding us and uniting us in a special way. It was a life imparting experience in the word, prayer, and sharing together as a family.

After opening with worship and prayer, we took the time to listen to an audio clip of Bishop Raphael Green recounting the early days of our home church in St. Louis. Immediately, the church family picked up on the similarities of our journey in these early days for us. We took the time to talk about it in great depth. That's what made the time so valuable. There was no time limit so we were able to really talk and share our hearts fully all night.

Then we played a video clip of some prophetic words that we have never released publicly. In this video we listened to the prophetic words and warnings that came to us regarding the assembly of a core leadership team. The emphasis was on guarding against division and strife. There was also an exhortation for us to make integrity the hallmark of this ministry. The Word of the Lord was for us to demand it of our people and of all of those who were following us. Afterwards, we had a very long and in-depth discussion regarding the price that must be paid to lay a foundation for this ministry to build upon.

It was a precious moment as we listened to the church family talk about how just hearing this word was affecting them. My only caution is that we don't harshly judge those who cannot make a commitment to joining us in our mission. Everyone that comes to our church is not meant to stay at our church. Some will come, receive what they need, and move on. Others will receive what they need, make a life investment to help us, and then move on. Some will be with us for the rest of their lives. That's just how it is.

We should never look upon those who come and go, as if they are doing something wrong against us. For many people, this ministry will be a hospital. They will come, get healed, and leave. You don't expect patients to stay in a hospital. It will be the same for many that come. Some people, after they get healed, will want to stay and learn how to allow God to use them to bring healing to others. It

doesn't make one type of person better than the other. God knows where each person is in their maturity and their capabilities.

Our role is to be a mom, dad, brother, sister, or friend. We are to be an example of unconditional acceptance and total commitment to what is best for them. For some people, the best thing for them is to move on after they get healed. For others, the best thing will be for them to stay a while. Our attitude is to be one of love and acceptance, no matter what type of person comes our way. That's why we're fasting and praying - so that our hearts and minds are ready to receive people, no matter how they come or go.

We also disclosed our new slogan, "We're Not Building a Ministry - We're Building People." You may have noticed it on the website already. It's just that we're making it official now. Finally, we concluded by disclosing the strategy for 2008. One of the biggest events planned for this year, is the official confirmation of our newest members of this church during the celebration of our third anniversary. The celebration will take place in March during Resurrection weekend.

I want to encourage you to keep fasting and praying with us. I will continue to fast each weekend until we see the breakthrough. Those who desire to join me, please do so as the Lord leads.

As we taught during our overnight sharing, God uses fasting and prayer to change us in a way that makes us able to handle the responsibility of the breakthrough. We are asking God to send more people, but we must be able to handle the attitudes and issues that come with more people. We may ask God for more money, but we must be able to handle the increase in expenses and financial pressures that come with having more.

Jesus said, "No one puts a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old garment; for the patch pulls away from the garment, and the tear is made worse. Nor do they put new wine into old wineskins, or else the wineskins break, the wine is spilled, and the wineskins are ruined. But they put new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved." (Matthew 9:16-17)

Many years ago, God gave me the following song:

God will not sew His new move onto our old ways of thinking. He will not pour in new wine and fresh revelation into our old, stiff, hardened wineskin. Fasting and prayer enables God to give us a new garment and a fresh wine skin so we can handle the new thing that HE wants to give us.

If we are not changed, we'll do and say things that will turn people away from the Lord. We'll be no different than any other group of people that turned people away. We will only receive the kind of people that we like. We'll expect people to behave a certain way when they come.

However, people don't always come to a church with right attitudes and committed hearts. Many will have their defenses up because they have been beaten down so many times. Many will come with suspicion. They will come disgruntled, complaining, uncommitted, and sometimes rebellious. People are hurting and many are desperate. They will pull on you or lash out at you. Some will rub you the wrong way. They will offend you and not give it a second thought. So what prepares us for this harvest? Fasting and prayer prepares us.

We have learned that no amount of money and no great anointing will compensate for dealing with these issues in a church. Carol and I are just a husband and wife, a mom and a dad, whom God put His hand on. We have failed over and over again, but our heart is to follow hard after the presence of God. So we encourage you to follow us as we follow Christ.

Come on family, let's do this! Remember, we're not here to build a ministry. We're here to build people.

Yesterday, my daily Bible Reading included one of the scriptures that are part of the foundational makeup of my heart and life.

1 Corinthians 1:26-29 (New King James Version):

For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called. But **God** has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and **God** has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty; and the base things of the world and the things which are despised **God** has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are, that no flesh should glory in His presence.

I just sat and worshipped for a minute after reading this word. I was preparing for an extremely busy day. Three briefings, including two sessions with high level people, were awaiting me. In a couple of hours, I would be sitting in rooms with some powerful and influential people. They are power brokers. They have money, reputations, influence, affluence, education, and skill.

I have none of the things that they have. I will sit at a desk and advance the slides of a Power Point presentation. I'm not belittling myself. It's just a reality for the day that awaited me. But the Lord took the time to remind me that it's not many earthly wise, noble or mighty people who are called. He has chosen the foolish, weak, base and despised things.

How good it is to know that from the criteria of God, I qualified to be one of His choices. I knew that I must share this with the church family this week.

As we continue to prepare for a new launch in March, we are aware that our church family is one of those foolish things that God chooses to confound the wisdom of this world. How can a small gathering - a family - reach an entire generation? We don't have the wisdom of this world. We are not born of nobility. We have no connections and high rankings. In fact, we are base. That word means we are just common, regular, everyday people. We are not

the most talented and gifted. By comparison to others, we are weak. Yet, God has chosen us –

Of all the descriptions that can be attached to us, the only one that matters is this: **We are chosen**.

Remember, one of the theme scriptures of this ministry is **John 15:16**, "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."

So, we just want to encourage you today. It doesn't matter what the circumstances are in your life right now. It doesn't matter how things are going on your job. It doesn't matter how stressful and intense it may be in your family relationships. The bottom line is that **God has chosen you**.

So we insist that if you are trying to be accepted by those who seem to have the wisdom to excel in this world, remember God has already chosen you. If you are trying to be accepted by the noble or the mighty of this society, then remember, God has already chosen you. This is part of our calling. We will be despised. That's been part of our learning and preparation process. We've had to learn to stop striving to be accepted. God has already chosen those who will be part of ushering in His new move in this generation. We're just raising our voices and lifting our hands to say, "Those who are chosen to unite with us in this calling, come on home!"

Many years ago, the Lord gave me a song called "Base In Your Face":

Casting Out the Net

We've asked our young people to prepare another video production for that Sunday. We also have a special couple from our home church (and our weekly home cell group), coming to bless your life that weekend.

God uses Quincy and Sherri Moore in a unique combination of humor, exhortation, encouragement, and the prophetic. We've asked them to share with you, in a personal and intimate time on Saturday evening in our home. We always like to give you a chance to get know the people that we invite, before you see them "on stage."

Since we are inviting people who have not been in church for a long time, we felt that Quincy and Sherri were picked by the Lord to speak to them, and to all of us, on the anniversary theme of Recovery and Restoration. We know they will be humorous as they share from their own lives, but they will also be mightily used of God to speak to people who have gotten hurt or disappointed and been away from the church, and to those who have been trapped in religion and tradition. It's going to be an exciting weekend.

We'll make some more fliers and cards/invitations for you to give to others as we prepare for our anniversary theme of Recovery and Restoration. We don't know how many people will show up, but we're going to cast out the net anyway. Family, we're going to do our part to get ready for whatever God wants to do that weekend and beyond.

Set Up to Step Up

You know that we're busy getting prepared for the new member confirmation and the celebration of three years of ministry, but we don't want to lose sight of what's really happening.

Do you realize that God is setting you up to step into His purpose for giving you life and breath? All of us have been through storms, rains, heartbreaks and shame. From the second you were born, the forces of sin and evil have been set against you, to keep you from coming into the knowledge of the glory of God.

All through your childhood you were attacked and tormented as everything the enemy could send was launched against you. Demonic forces tried to get you to blame God and hate Him. They tried to get you to hate yourself and everyone around you. Your parents were under this assault and you were born in the middle of a war. There have been waves and waves of destruction that have come to steal, kill, and to destroy you and the purpose God had for you.

In spite of all of that, God, by His spirit, still got through to you and rescued your soul from death and hell. Even though the focus is on Moses, God actually used the family. Moses had a speech impediment so Aaron actually did the talking for him. When they had their first victory, (crossing the Red Sea), Miriam led the entire nation in praise and worship.

What am I saying? God has raised up another little family and you are part of it. Could it be that you are called to be a part of something so awesome that it goes beyond what you could have ever thought or asked?

When I look at the high intensity of battles and struggles each of you has had, it is an indicator that you were meant for something great. Thousands of babies were killed all around baby Moses, but he was preserved. God has also preserved you for this very time in the history of mankind. Don't be afraid to believe such a great thing about God. You didn't choose yourself. HE chose you.

Now, out of the ashes of destruction, divorce, detours, distractions, disease, desertion, devastation, discouragement, disappointment, and even death comes a group of people - a family that God has brought together to fulfill His purpose in the earth. He has not called us to be famous, but we are called to be faithful. That is part of the story of all our lives. God has been faithful to us through it all and He now calls us forth to be a faithful church in the midst of an unfaithful generation.

So, as we make all of these preparations for next month, we want you to keep in mind what this is really all about. God has called you and He has chosen you to do something great with Him in our generation.

The enemy could not stop you. He has tried for many, many years, but here you are, standing on the brink of the greatest adventure of your life. It's not a fantasy and it's not a fairy tale. This is the real thing. Come on family. Let's do what God has called and chosen us to do. We have a commission and we don't want to forfeit it because of fear, frustration, pride, or unbelief. That's what all of this is really about!

Once in a Lifetime Opportunities

We're still rejoicing in the Lord from the wonderful way in which He ministered to our souls last Sunday. We completed our session on the Beliefs of this church, but afterwards, the Lord gave us a word to share with everyone regarding **Once in a Lifetime Opportunities**.

From the parable in Matthew 25, in which Jesus talked about the wise and foolish virgins who were waiting for the coming of the bridegroom, we were able to extract a Kingdom of God principle. Even though this passage is mainly taught about from the standpoint of being prepared for Jesus to return (and rightfully so, this is the correct teaching), there is an application of this scripture that can be made to our lives every day.

The point the Lord gave us to emphasize, was that **once in a life time opportunities are coming**. There is no doubt that your expected breakthrough is coming. The issue is this: *Will you be ready when it comes?* Are you preparing yourself for the next level of your life? You must be prepared when the offer comes to financially assist you with your education. You must be prepared when the opportunity comes to start a business. You must be prepared when God brings your spouse into your life. You must be prepared when God brings explosion to the ministry.

This parable is the reason why we have spent so much time in preparation as a family and as a church. Scores of people are going to be caught in the net that we are casting out. Hundreds of families are going to be brought into our midst. Thousands of lives will be impacted by this ministry, but we must be prepared for the responsibility and the battles that come with the breakthrough.

Now is the time to let God deal with us regarding our personal fears and prejudices. Now is the time to face our feelings regarding certain types of people or attitudes that we just can't tolerate because those are the kind of people that are going to come to this church. Now is the time to trust God in helping us to overcome the small obstacles so that we can trust Him when we come up against the giants that are waiting for us to march into their territory. Now is the time to get planted and rooted in the Word of God so that the life

of God can be pushed up and through us like the sap that is pushed through a tree and into the branches to produce leaves and fruit.

As I told you Sunday, winter is over and it's been a long, harsh, and bitterly cold one, but the season is changing. The atmosphere is changing in this generation and we're beginning to see new life. New leaves will come forth. New fruit will be brought forth. The past three years have been very, very hard. God is redeeming and restoring things in our lives. Yes, He is healing our wounds and rejuvenating our souls. After we relocated, we could see that God was repositioning us. He was putting us in a position to be blessed. He was putting us in a place to become a blessing.

Now, as the spring returns in the natural, it's another season of new life and new beginnings for us as well. At this same time last year, we were celebrating with an expectation that God was going to do something special. We were facing foreclosure and had no way to move forward and we could not go backwards. All we knew was that by 2008 we would be in different place.

Well, it's 2008 and we are in a different place. Once again, we know that things will be different by this time next year. Once again we sense that God is going to move us, but this time it won't be a rescue move. It will be a recovery move. God will recover and restore all that was lost.

Now we can see that the past three and a half years have been part of the purchasing of the oil for our lamps. Now were are trimming our lamps and awaiting the coming of the bridegroom. And when that once in a lifetime moment comes, our church family will be ready.

Having said that, I have one word of caution. This word of caution comes from 30+ years of life and ministry experience. My caution is this: don't allow the picture that you have in your head to dominate the vision and process that God has for us. I have found that most of the time our expectations are very different from God's plan. The Lord knows that we have needs and He knows we have petitions and requests before Him. But please know that God does not have to, and will not answer those prayers in the ways we think He should do it.

As we approach our anniversary celebration, we are looking for God to do something great, but my expectation is not in the number of people that come. It's in the number of people that are impacted by the presence and the word of God. Carol and I are praying about WHO comes, not HOW MANY people come. We have learned through the years that big crowds don't mean big impact. Large crowds don't create long-term change. We are after long term, permanent change.

My experience, with various people in the church has shown me that people are trying to launch big, gigantic events and big, gigantic churches that they think will change this city. I've been in meeting after meeting where people and pastors were trying to put together events that would draw huge crowds. That effort fails time after time, and over the past 30 years it has not brought about the necessary change.

What God is telling us to do is to follow the principles of the Kingdom of God. These principles say cast out a net and then separate the good from the bad. After the separation, there is usually a very small number of good. With that small number, you start building.

These principles say the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds. I've actually seen a mustard seed. It's so small you can barely see it in your hand. The Kingdom of God is like that mustard seed. It starts out very small but after it is planted it eventually becomes a very large tree.

This is what we see. God has assembled a small group and now we are casting our net and God is going to increase us a little more. If we prove ourselves to be faithful with the next set of people, then He can add a few more. We don't see a giant leap in attendance. We see the kind of steady growth that the Lord promised through a prophetic word from our Bishop.

Remember the prophetic word was that our growth would be faster than our home church, but God would cause it to be a slow steady growth. That sounds like a contradiction but it's not. The history of our home church was that the growth would come in sudden spurts. We'd go for months with no growth and then the attendance would

suddenly jump by 25 to 50 people in a month's time. We grew from 7 people to 700 people over a course of ten years.

Since the Word of the Lord is that our growth would be steady that means we will start out very small, as we have, but we won't see giant leaps of attendance. It will be a few people at a time attending and that will be steady and consistent. We share this with you so that you are not disappointed by our growth and attendance. We are looking for God to do it the way that He told us He would do it.

So we are purchasing our oil now. We are making the sacrifices in prayer and fasting. We are studying the Word of God and becoming familiar with His presence and His voice. We will be ready for that once in a lifetime moment of opportunity. The opportunity is not an event. The opportunity is a spiritual breakthrough that will come in hearts and lives.

God's Way or No Way

There is great encouragement in my heart for you as I write this week's letter. This is a season in which we are placing everything before the Lord. It's a time in which we are declaring, "God, it's going to be your way or no way!"

When Carol and I are speaking to you each week, it is not a mere pep talk. This is not a high school pep rally to fire up everyone before we go into a sports game. Pep rallies are conducted all over the country yet everyone knows that somebody is going to lose the game. Some pep rallies are nothing more than a time to hype up everyone and get them prepared for the inevitable defeat.

Well, that's not the case with our church family because our weekly gatherings are not pep rallies. These are solid strategic moments in time in which God is making powerful impartations into your spirit. He is driving out all fear and replacing it with faith. He's driving the fear out with His love, with His unconditional acceptance, and His total commitment to fulfilling His purpose and will through your life. If you didn't have a purpose, you would never have been born.

I **know** (and you can hold the word know for about ten seconds) what I'm preaching about right now. I was in my mother's womb while she was wailing in the pain of grief and loss. She had suddenly lost her youngest child by a horrible food choking accident. Two months later she still had to find the strength and the will to give birth to another. When I came into the world, there was the shadow of death all over my family. Still, they gave God the sacrifice of praise and worship.

Then the Lord gave my mother a vision for the baby boy she had just given birth to. He showed her a tree with large fruit. The tree was full and yet not one single piece of fruit was on the ground. If you've ever seen any kind of fruit tree, you know that is a miracle. There is always some piece of fruit on the ground under a fruit tree but God showed her a tree with no lost fruit. When she asked the Lord what the vision meant, the Lord answered her and said, "I'm going to make this child very fruitful from his life."

I declare this, not to boast of myself, but to speak in the boldness of the Lord. This ministry was named **Fruitful Life** because of the word over my life as a new born baby. This ministry is connected to God's word. It's about God's purpose. It is connected to God's promise. Throughout the Bible we see where God chooses a man or a woman and we often see His word declared over them as babies, children, or as young adults.

Before I knew my own name, God had given me a purpose. I was born after great loss. I was born to declare life after death, recovery after loss, restoration after destruction, success after failure, provision after poverty, and purpose after pain.

It's not about the messenger. It's about the message. I'm just a messenger, but God sent the message. God sent us to here to speak life. He sent us here to bear fruit. According to His Word in John 15:16, that fruit will remain. You won't fall off the tree because of premature growth. You won't fall off the tree because someone held you back and you became overripe. No, you will be handpicked by the Lord himself, at the right time.

Some will be healed and come alongside to help us in this new move of God. The Lord has been moving on me in crystal clear prophetic foresight lately and I'm greatly encouraged because I'm seeing God send laborers from around the nation and the world to come and help us in this generation. Take courage because help is on the way! So don't worry Family. God answered our cry when we asked Him to send forth laborers into the harvest.

Back in our home church we used to have a saying amongst the young adults - one phrase to sum up our hearts when it came to paying any price or making any sacrifice. We gave a certain salute and we would say, "For the harvest!"

That phrase meant, "I'll do whatever God says. I'll go where He tells me to go. I'll stay where He tells me to stay. I'll do whatever it takes. I'll obey Him, no matter what."

I know you're going through many things in your life right now. We are too. But, when we think about the losses we've had since we've been here, it's worth it because it's **for the harvest!** When we think about the long nights and heartbreaking days, it's worth it because it's **for the harvest!** When I think about how much we've longed to be with our family, friends, and spiritual sons and daughters in St. Louis, we can endure the separation because it's **for the harvest!** When we look back over the past couple years of being buried in the ground and abiding alone like a seed in the ground, we can say that it's worth it because it's **for the harvest!** When we look back and see how God has stepped in and changed your lives and united us as a new family and ministry, it's worth it because it's **for the harvest!**

With no big congregation to impress and no critics to try to disprove, we simply gave the Word of God to the church family. It's amazing how differently you communicate when you're no longer concerned about public performances or evaluations. You give the Word of God to the people God in purity and sincerity. You don't edit yourself and you don't second guess yourself. You just write down the thoughts of God as they come pouring through you.

It no longer occurred to me that we were still in winter. The emphasis changed from focusing on the snow and cold (spiritually speaking) to getting the people of God ready and positioned for the purpose of God to be released in their lives.

I realized, after I read through the emails again, that we didn't focus on the fact that spring was coming. We just declared the Word of the Lord. God taught me some valuable lessons during that winter. It was as if we were blooming in the winter season. God caused new life to spark in us even though it was winter.

I always wondered how trees and vegetation could possibly have life within them in spite of the bitter cold of winter. After all the ice and sub-zero wind chills the leaves would return and the grass would slowly change from brown to green. Now I have a better understanding after the way the Lord dealt with us during that winter. Now I can see that the radiant life within is greater than the chill of death without.
